

Terms and Conditions

- Please read this section carefully and ensure that you understand it before signing the online application.
- I hereby agree to abide by the following conditions. These conditions are not optional.
- I will supply all equipment required for my stall
- I will immediately remove from sale or display any goods deemed not suitable for a family festival by the District Council of Ceduna (DCC) or its representatives.
- I agree to sell only the items listed in the "Goods to be Sold" section of this form.
- I understand that if I cancel this booking after 1 September 2026, any site fee paid will not be refunded (if applicable).
- I understand that the final position of the site is at the discretion of the Event Coordinator and may change without notice. I agree to be bound by the Site Officer's direction regarding the final placement of my site.
- If the event is cancelled for any reason, no compensation will be sought. Refund of the site fee is at the discretion of the DCC.
- Indoor sites may be placed in a marquee where entertainment is also offered. If a stallholder specifically does not wish to be located in a marquee where entertainment is also offered, they must notify the Event Coordinator at the time of booking. An additional fee may apply.
- Security guards will patrol the site each night between 11:00 pm and 7:00 am; however, each stallholder is responsible at all times for the security of items at their stall.
- The following information is provided to ensure all site holders have a clear understanding of their responsibilities to patrons and staff.
- Please ensure that you read and check that all required measures are in place. Site inspections and inductions will be conducted prior to the event.

Liquor Requirements

- Liquor Licence: All vendors selling or supplying alcohol must comply with the conditions of the Ceduna Oysterfest 2026 Short Term Liquor Licence, including permitted service times, sales limits, approved containers and any other conditions of the licence.
- Display: A copy of the Liquor Licence and any relevant notices must be displayed in a prominent position at each liquor outlet for the duration of the event.
- RSA: All staff who sell, offer to sell or serve alcohol must have completed the required RSA training. Vendors are responsible for ensuring copies of relevant staff RSA certificates are available onsite and can be produced upon request.
- Responsibility: Vendors are responsible for ensuring their staff understand and comply with the Liquor Licence requirements at all times.

Electrical Safety

- Residual Current Devices (RCDs) must be used where required, including for all hand-held electrical appliances and tools.
- All portable electrical equipment, including leads, must be tested every six or twelve months in accordance with AS/NZS 3760:2022 In-Service Safety Inspection and Testing of Electrical Equipment and RCDs, and AS 3533 – Amusement Rides and Devices. Tagging is also recommended.
- All power cords and power boards must be electrically tested and tagged to ensure the safety of all persons on site.
- Adequate protection must be provided to protect the public from electric shock and minimise trip hazards, including the use of cable covers.
- All leads, plugs and associated equipment must be protected from weather and environmental conditions, including water.
- Evidence of electrical safety compliance, such as tags or supporting documentation, must be provided upon request from an authorised person.

Permits, Licensing and Registration

- A Food Business Number must be supplied where applicable.

Ladder Safety

- Ladders must be well maintained and suitable for the type of work being undertaken. For example, approved ladders must be used for electrical work and for work at heights under two metres only.
- An assessment must be undertaken to determine whether the work is suitable for ladder use, including whether the worker can maintain three points of contact at all times.
- Assistance from a second person must be provided where required.

Liquid Petroleum Gas (LPG) Cylinders and Heaters

- Small gas cylinders should be used wherever possible.
- Cylinders exceeding nine kilograms must be hard-plumbed, stored outside and fitted by a licensed gas fitter.
- LPG cylinders must be secured to increase stability.
- LPG cylinders must be kept clear of ignition sources and located in a well-ventilated area in accordance with AS/NZS 1596:2026 – The Storage and Handling of LP Gas.
- All LPG cylinders must be inspected to ensure they do not exceed ten years from their stamped test date.

Access and Egress

- Entry and exit areas must be kept clear and easily accessible for staff and expected crowd numbers.
- Entry and exit areas must be adequate for emergency evacuations and emergency service access.

Signage

- Appropriate signage must be displayed for any hazardous areas or substances.
- First aid and fire extinguisher locations must be clearly identified with signage.

Fire Prevention

- Suitable fire extinguishers, including CO₂, water or chemical extinguishers, and fire blankets must be provided in appropriate locations. All equipment must be tested, maintained and within the required inspection dates.

Staff, Volunteer and Contractor Training

- Contractors must provide detailed information regarding safe operating procedures and a current Certificate of Currency.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

- Appropriate PPE must be provided where required, including items such as gloves, aprons and ear protection.

Proper Conduct

- Exhibitors are expected to be mindful and respectful of all premises, fellow exhibitors and all persons encountered while attending Oysterfest Ceduna.
- Abusive, inappropriate or unacceptable behaviour will not be tolerated.
